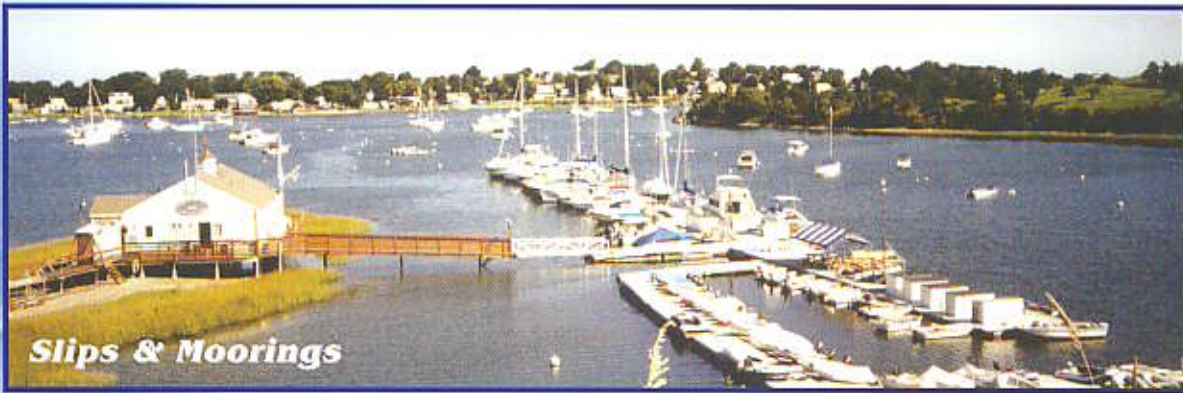

The Recreational Boating Business (“Marine Trades”) is one of the fastest growing industries in Massachusetts, and across the Country. Over 25 billion dollars were spent on recreational boating in the U.S. in year 2000. Over 75 million Americans participated in recreational boating (again in year 2000).

Here in Massachusetts, there are upwards of 200,000 registered and documented recreational boats. we have access to nearly 1200 ramps and public access points and over 35,000 moorings and slips. Indeed slips and moorings are hard to come by in most of our communities.

The two greatest needs in the recreational marine industry are personnel and dockage. Many of the jobs portrayed in this brochure are critically understaffed. The greatest need is for qualified technicians to service boats and marine power units (inboard, outboard, stern drive motors, etc).





Trailer Repair

Consumer demand for marine goods and services has taxed the industry's capacity to fill boaters' needs. Good and timely service is especially desirable. Hence we have a critical need for repair technicians, riggers, boatyard personnel, fiberglass repairers, and others.

Pay scales and benefits have soared as a result. Combine these facts with the fun factor that is part of boating and the marine trades. Add to the mix that many of these jobs are recession proof ("If they aren't buying they are fixing"), and we have very attractive job opportunities.
